

Celebrating Tenth Consecutive Year of Summer Youth Internship Program

In its tenth year, the Summer Youth Internship Program (SYIP) has continued to make a profound impact on the Miami-Dade community. This initiative, a collaborative effort between The Children’s Trust, Miami-Dade County, Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), CareerSource South Florida, EdFed - The Educational Federal Credit Union, The DeLuca Foundation, Griffin Catalyst, and the M-DCPS Foundation (formerly known as the Foundation for New Education Initiatives), is dedicated to providing meaningful paid summer internships for youth across the region.

For the summer of 2025, the program attracted a substantial number of applicants, with 5,219 youth applying for the opportunity. Out of these, 3,661 students were successfully placed in internships across various participating providers throughout the county. Notably, 1,198 of the students placed in internships, or 32.7%, were from the Exceptional Student Education (ESE) program. This group included students who were gifted and 29.8% with varying exceptionalities.

Additionally, 572 students earned dual enrollment college credit from Miami Dade College as part of their internship experience.

Reflecting the program’s commitment to supporting economically disadvantaged students, 51.8% of the participants qualified for free or reduced-price lunch.

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A Look Into This Year's Internships

M-DCPS Receives More Than \$3.2 Million for Aviation and Aerospace Programs



A second SpaceHUB Magnet program will be established at Booker T. Washington Senior High School.

Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) has received more than \$3.2 million from the state to enhance career training opportunities in aviation and aerospace fields.

Florida's Education Commissioner Anastasios Kamoutsas distributed \$40 million statewide for workforce education initiatives, with M-DCPS receiving \$3,249,247 of this allocation. These funds will establish a second SpaceHUB Magnet program at Booker T. Washington Senior High School.

Created through collaboration with Space Florida, this SpaceHUB responds to increasing industry requirements for qualified workers in aerospace and defense. The program emerged from workforce analysis conducted through the Perkins Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment and consultations with sector professionals.

Students will choose from three career-focused specialty areas: Aerospace Applied Engineering, where they learn about designing, developing, and testing aircraft and spacecraft components; Aerospace Applied Robotics, which covers automated systems and robotics applications in aerospace production and operations; and Aerospace Electrical Systems, where participants gain skills in installing, diagnosing, and maintaining aircraft avionics and electrical systems.

M-DCPS opened its first SpaceHUB at Hialeah-Miami Lakes Senior High following a 2024 state grant, with plans for a third location.

TEACH Grant

"The TEACH Grant Program provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching. A TEACH Grant-eligible program is a program of study that is designed to prepare you to teach as a highly qualified teacher in a high-need field and that leads to a bachelor's or master's degree or is a postbaccalaureate program. A two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree is considered a program that leads to a bachelor's degree. A postbaccalaureate program is not TEACH-Grant-eligible if it is offered by a school that also offers a bachelor's degree in education.

Schools that participate in the TEACH Grant Program determine which of the programs they offer are TEACH-Grant-eligible. A program that is TEACH-Grant-eligible at one school might not be TEACH-Grant-eligible at another school. Additionally, even if a program meets the eligibility requirements to be a TEACH-Grant-eligible program, it may not be designated as TEACH-Grant-eligible by the school. Contact the financial aid office at the school you are attending (or that you plan to attend) to find out which programs at that school are eligible."
