Miami Beach Nautilus Middle School was a recipient of a 2021-2022 Foundation for New Education Initiatives (FNEI) grant. Funds supported Augmented Instruction Using Augmented Reality! which brought virtual reality into the classroom as a supplemental resource to modernize and improve instruction. Student engagement increased drastically, and assessment scores related to the material the virtual reality was used to reinforce improved as well.

Augmented Instruction Using Augmented Reality!'s greatest impact was its transformative power in the classroom. The use of virtual reality headsets in the classroom revolutionized the way students interact with the curriculum and boosted student engagement. Students were able to explore 3D models of cells in a virtual environment, comparing their relative size and shapes. Students were able to visit different ecosystems in the word using the National Geographic Explore Virtual Reality app. Students were able to view a virtual dissection in 3D before beginning their own real-life shark dissections. Students also used an anatomy app to look inside a human body at the different systems and organs within it and how they interact with each other. Students were also able to explore space and planetary systems using space-themed apps. FNEI Mini-Grant funds helped Miami Beach Nautilus Middle School and its Augmented Instruction Using Augmented Reality! program reach great heights.

The Verizon Innovative Learning Schools program

M-DCPS was recently awarded 3 Verizon Learning Labs from Verizon. Verizon labs will be located at Andover Middle, Carol City Middle and West Miami Middle Schools. These schools will join the other 47 new Verizon Innovative Learning Labs in Title I Schools. In total, there are 568 schools in 95 districts across 37 states.

The Verizon Innovative Learning Schools program, in partnership with nonprofit Digital Promise, equips students and teachers at select Title I schools across the country with free technology devices, free internet access, and innovative STEM learning programs through integrating technology into the learning experience and on-going educator support.



TEACH Grant

The TEACH Grant Program provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching.

A TEACH Grant-eligible program is a program of study that is designed to prepare you to teach as a highly qualified teacher in a high-need field and that leads to a bachelor's or master's degree or is a postbaccalaureate program. A two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree is considered a program that leads to a bachelor's degree. A postbaccalaureate program is not TEACH-Grant-eligible if it is offered by a school that also offers a bachelor's degree in education.

Schools that participate in the TEACH Grant Program determine which of the programs they offer are TEACH-Grant-eligible. A program that is TEACH-Grant-eligible at one school might not be TEACH-Grant-eligible at another school. Additionally, even if a program meets the eligibility requirements to be a TEACH-Grant-eligible program, it may not be designated as TEACH-Grant-eligible by the school. Contact the financial aid office at the school you are attending (or that you plan to attend) to find out which programs at that school are eligible.
