M-DCPS to expand Blind Soccer program with Bridgestone Grant Award

Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) was recently awarded a \$25,000 grant from Bridgestone Americas, Inc. to support the Blind Soccer Initiative. This transformative program empowers visually impaired students, fosters inclusive communities, and cultivates skills for lifelong success for all participants. The pilot program will expand in 2026 to 66 schools directly impacting approximately 57,800 students. This \$25,000 grant award will help build a program that can open doors for students to participate in organized competitive sports at regional and national competitions, potentially paving the way to scholarships and pathways to the Paralympics in 2028.



M-DCPS staff trains over the summer and hosts an inclusion kickoff event to launch the pilot program.

USABA began its blind soccer programming in 2018, and in 2019 USABA became a member organization of US Soccer. Team USA will make its Paralympic debut as the host nation of the Los Angeles 2028 Games.

Examples of eligible projects include transforming a vacant lot into a community garden, rebuilding a school playground, or helping senior citizens ready their home for winter. If applying on the behalf of an entire class or student group, the foundation requests that applicants designate a maximum of three student leaders to be the main points of contact for the project.



Fruit Tree Orchard Donation Grant

"FTPf seeks schools that can accommodate at least 20 to 25 trees on school grounds (planted at 15-foot intervals) near existing irrigation sources (e.g., spigot or sprinklers). Eligible applicants must own the planting site or have long-term arrangements to remain at the planting site, be committed to caring for the trees in perpetuity, and coordinate local volunteers to help with the tree planting. Recipients must agree that the orchard will not be used for any for-profit enterprise."


TEACH Grant

"The TEACH Grant Program provides grants of up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing or plan to complete course work needed to begin a career in teaching. A TEACH Grant-eligible program is a program of study that is designed to prepare you to teach as a highly qualified teacher in a high-need field and that leads to a bachelor's or master's degree or is a postbaccalaureate program. A two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree is considered a program that leads to a bachelor's degree. A postbaccalaureate program is not TEACH-Grant-eligible if it is offered by a school that also offers a bachelor's degree in education.

Schools that participate in the TEACH Grant Program determine which of the programs they offer are TEACH-Grant-eligible. A program that is TEACH-Grant-eligible at one school might not be TEACH-Grant-eligible at another school. Additionally, even if a program meets the eligibility requirements to be a TEACH-Grant-eligible program, it may not be designated as TEACH-Grant-eligible by the school. Contact the financial aid office at the school you are attending (or that you plan to attend) to find out which programs at that school are eligible."


